Originally from Beaver Dam, WI, and a Beaver Dam High School graduate, he resides in Minneapolis. Minnesota, where he works as a freelance photographer. His stories and images have been in major publications, including Forbes Magazine and National Geographic. His latest of four books, "Lessons on the Road to Peace," received the Non-Fiction 2024 Minnesota Book Award. His multimedia project, "A Peace of My Mind," reflecting stories that bridge divides and encourage dialogue, is widely shown throughout the country.

On September 14 through 20, AAUW-Beaver Dam branch will host acclaimed author, photographer, and peace advocate John Noltner in Beaver Dam, originally his hometown, to share "A Peace of My Mind" stories and photos that he has gathered from people across this country. Throughout the week, his exhibit will be at the Dodge County Center for the Arts, 130 W. Maple Ave., free to the public, including extended hours. During the week-long community-wide residency, Noltner will be collecting more stories and photos from a broad representation of local people who will sit for a portrait and answer the question, "What does 'Belonging' mean to you?" His closing keynote address on Saturday, September 20, will include some of those participants.

In addition to the exhibit and portrait sessions, AAUW is collaborating with community entities to provide the following free programs by Noltner: Tuesday, Sept. 16, 7:30 to 9:00 AM - Exhibit commentary at the Dodge County Center for the Arts during the Beaver Dam Area Chamber of Commerce Breakfast; Wednesday, Sept.17 – 8:30 AM, a presentation at The Watermark; Thursday, Sept. 18, 10 to 11:30 AM – A discussion at the Beaver Dam Community Library about Noltner's books, including his latest award-winning publication, "Lessons on the Road to Peace," at the library's temporary location, 1701 N Spring St.; Saturday, Sept. 20, 10 AM to noon - A free Photo Techniques class at Art on the Town, 120 Front St. (*Register at www.artonthetownwi.com*); 1:30 to 3:30 - "Meet the Artist" at the Dodge County Center for the Arts, sponsored by the Beaver Dam Community Library. To conclude those activities, on Saturday, September 20, there will be a public reception at 6:00 PM at the BDACT Fine Arts Center, 117 W. Maple Ave. followed by Noltner's closing program at 7:00 PM.

Also, Noltner will be conducting classes, workshops, and programs at Moraine Park Technical College, Beaver Dam High School, Beaver Dam Middle School and Wayland Academy.

Throughout all of his endeavors since his graduation from Beaver Dam High School and UW-Eau-Claire, Noltner's guiding words continue to be, "In a world that asks us to focus on the things that can separate us, A Peace of My Mind invites us to explore the common humanity that connects us." His multi-media project is based on the belief that art and storytelling can help individuals, organizations and

communities articulate their deepest values and encourage action toward building social capital and community connections.

Although his home base is Bloomington, MN, since 2009, Noltner and his wife Karen have picked up stakes to travel over 90,000 miles across four continents and at hundreds of campuses and diverse communities to "bridge divides and encourage dialogue." Recently, he led a team of college students to make connections with the people of Northern Ireland.

With images and words as his medium, Noltner has been telling stories for twenty years for national magazines, Fortune 500 companies, and non-profit organizations. His work has appeared in National Geographic Traveler, Forbes Magazine, Midwest Living, and the New York Daily News, among other publications. He has produced several books reflecting his journeys and his "A Peace of My Mind" exhibit which has been widely displayed throughout the U.S. has been shown at the Nobel Peace Prize forum. The University of Minnesota and the University of Wisconsin hold his work in their permanent collections.

In anticipation of his return to his hometown to ask the question, "What does 'Belonging' mean to you?" Noltner shared what belonging meant to him while growing up in Beaver Dam. "Beaver Dam's music and theater community gave me a sense of belonging by offering a supportive place to explore my creativity, and it laid the foundation for all the work I do today."
